

Hands-on curriculum


During our unique communitybased education curriculum you effectively learn a variety of aspects of Japanese society and the world through seminars and interactions with community activists, business and political leaders.

During the activities you interact with the local community and get to share your culture as well as contribute to the community and so develop compassion and skills to contribute to society.





- Useful Japanese phrases will be taught
- More advanced speakers will have public speaking opportunities

- •General age limit is 17 ~ 45 years old (some exceptions)

Unique access to Japan Price Comparison!

If you travel Japan on your own, for the same amount of time as a Session

- •Accommodations: Yen10,000 x 20 days = Yen200,000 (Euro1,250)
- Meals: Yen4,500 x 20 days = Yen90,000 (Euro560)
- Local Transportations: Yen3,000 x 20 days = Yen 60,000 (Euro375)
- •Transportations Between Cities: Yen 40,000 (Euro250)
- Entrance Fees: Yen 30,000 (Euro190)

TOTAL:

Yen420,000(Basic need cost) + Staff/Guide/Interpreter + Others
